BEGINNING WITH A VERB

Pick a verb; any will do. How about chew? Think about the act of chewing and make a list of scenes that come to mind.

Here are a dozen to help you get started.

- 1. Dog chewing bone
- 2. Homeless man chewing Thanksgiving turkey
- 3. Children at breakfast table
- 4. Student chewing pencil during test
- 5. Puppy chewing toy
- 6. Man chewing tobacco
- 7. Friends chewing the fat
- 8. Eskimo woman chewing on leather
- 9. Baby chewing first
- 10.Baseball player chewing gum
- 11.Lion chewing its kill
- 12.Me not chewing my spinach

When you finish the list, select one of the original ideas and start another column on the board. Based on that one, ask your students to make a new list of what they imagine. You can keep making new lists but in a short time your students will have all sorts of ideas to think about and write about. Something will probably stir a memory and off they'll go. One advantage of this approach is that everyone winds up writing about something that interests them. They got to choose their subject.
