(Hint) Stick with clothes with special meaning. A shirt that's too big/small. A worn out pair of shoes/jeans. A coat that's unbelievably ugly. Your good-luck pants. FAMILY
(Hint) Be nice. These people may read what you write! ACCESSORIES
(Hint) Look at pictures on the walls, tabletops, bedside stands, lamps, and figurines. Look for things you know something about or would like to know more about.) KITCHEN
(Hint) This is one of the best rooms. It's full of utensils and cans and boxes and refrigerated food. All sorts of memories and experiences to choose from!) UNINVITED GUESTS
(Hint) Every house is also home to some characters we didn't invite in. Look hard enough, you'll probably spot a bug or two, maybe a teeny spider, an ant, a moth, perhaps a fly or even a wasp. Summer may bring gnats and other little pests that like to share your home.) WHATEVER
